Meegan earned her Bachelor of Music in Music Education at the Hartt School of Music and her Masters in Music History at Long Island University. Meegan, who has had numerous arranging commissions, has two choral pieces published by Carl Fischer - "Old Dan Tucker" and "American Ladies of Song". As a music educator for over 10 years, Meegan thoroughly understands the importance of the arts in everyones daily routine. To be able to share that gift with others and communicate that emotion is one of the most beneficial endeavors she has ever pursued.

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
