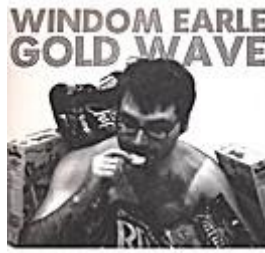

Currently based out of the North End in Halifax, NS, Windom Earle is comprised of Stephan MacLeod (guitar), Brad MacDougal (drums), Matt Pollard (bass), Nathan Pilon (sax), Nicole Anaka (glockenspiel), and Jen Clarke (synth). Windom Earle has showcased at SXSW, Pop Montreal, Sappy Fest, and The Halifax Pop Explosion. They have shared the stage with Buck 65, Akron/Family, Japanther, and Books On Tape. Windom Earle's latest release, "Gold Wave" topped the charts in CKDU's top 100 albums of 2006. Windom Earle gives techno such a wedgie, it might be more human.
