I'm recording my latest music in an old log cabin were I reside, which is located near Sheffy Hollow, in the woods, on a backroad, in Greene County, "East Tennessee." I call my style of music Mudsill (akin to creative minimalism), which can also be described by saying "if Piedmont Blues and sixties style Folk Music got married and had a baby, it would be called Mudsill." As an artist once stated, I never want to get completely comfortable with music by settling for whats already been created,
