It was so much fun they decided to do it again, this time doing ORIGINAL material. So "POP! RADIO" was born. It was made in the UPBEAT spirit of FUN! FUN! FUN! Oh, by the way. If you ever see a copy of "Beat The Meatles"...GRAB IT!! It's Gooooooooooooood. Gary Jeff hope you enjoy "POP! RADIO" as much as they do. They are already in the studio working on a follow up album.
