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Ian Pellow, multi-instrumentalist, has concocted an inspiring mixture of beautiful bass melodies, velvet keyboard sounds, passionate yearning rock, seasoned with a hint of exotic charm and a fragrance of Frank Zappa, Terry Kath and Jaco Pastorius 11 MP3 Songs ROCK: Progressive Rock, ROCK: Instrumental Rock Details: Ian Pellow, a common name for a common person? No, not even close. The name may be common but the man surely isn't. Ian had hidden talents which have creatively surfaced a couple of years ago with this brilliant freshly released debut CD as a result. Born in Montreal in 1961, he was a nice cute kid (as his mother will proudly confirm). He grew up influenced by the music his older brother Boyd was listening to - Chicago, Zappa, the Allman Brothers, Ella Fitzgerald, Joni Mitchell, Jaco Pastorius... to name but a few of the extensive list of quality musicians/songwriters who helped to shape Ian's musical style and direction. His father was a concert musician who played 1st Viola at the Montreal Symphony Orchestra, Baltimore and San Antonio Symphony in the States before becoming a music teacher back in Canada. And what do you do when your father is a music teacher... you learn music as soon as you can reach the keyboard of the piano or your fingers can curl around the neck of a guitar... lan started off with the piano at the age of 6, followed by the trumpet 2 years later and persisted with that for 10 years. At 15 his interest in bass was born after getting a Mansfield driftwood bass. Having Peter Cetera -Chicago- as his example, he taught himself how to play bass. A couple of bass guitars further... ... in 1980 a nice tax refund cheque dropped through the mailbox and it was spent on a B301AF Guild fretless bass. It was money well spent ! Ian toured Montreal with his brother and local bands but when Ian started working, employment took up all his time and the music was put on the shelf. It kept lingering ... as any true musician knows. Around 1997 he acquired a Rhodes piano, a Yamaha 4-track, a cheap Casio keyboard to play the drums and started writing music but his heart was not in it. In 1999 life took a turn in

an unexpected direction. Ian met his Belgian life mate. With just his fretless bass and a suitcase, he plunged into the unknown and has since emerged, 5 years later, having moved to Scotland, happy, writing, performing and recording as never before. The move to the beautiful Highlands has proved a very inspiring and creative one. The Yamaha 4-track was replaced with the Boss BR-8 and then again by the BR1180CD on which this debut album has been recorded. The Rhodes piano had to remain in Canada as the transport costs were a little too much to be true and replaced by a Korg M1. Not exactly the same but doing the job. An extra Guild - De Armond guitar joined the instruments family and some professional drum loops were purchased from Discrete Drums. Marti Who? slowly but surely started shaping up. In just under 6 months the songs rolled off the BR1180 unto the press. This CD is very likely to pleasantly surprise you with its diversity. None of the songs seem what they are and unexpected changes take you to other dimensions. Dora's Auras ethereal beginnings let you wonder and drift away on a jazzy breeze, dragging you into the heavier rock grooves of Funkaduck. Then there is the dramatic outcry of the guitars in Samba Not, the energetic Marti Who? with the bass taking on a life of its own. Nothing needs to be said about Jaco's Wake... tears in the eyes, memories of a great brilliant musician, long gone. Think of a loved one moved away, nothing left but memories... passionate feelings of the ungraspable past... Passionaire... yearning bass and guitars ... Bringing you to changes, changes and more changes in Meaty Changes. George... the omnipotent lemming hops happily around in the exotic garden of gentle guitar lines. No.8, waiting for the train, watching the misery all around. Heavy hungry guitar and compassionate bass lines... All in all, this is a wonderful debut album from a multi-instrumentalist worth a place in your collection !
