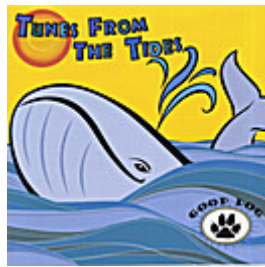


Mp3 Good Dog - Tunes From The Tides
