It was a beat up acoustic that I bought for 12 bucks from a friend of mine. I had no idea what a good guitar looked like (having no other family members that played music) but I was determined and played that thing until my fingers bled. I remember the strings being about an inch off the fretboard at the middle. I graduated to an electric guitar soon after and took some lessons. Formed my 1st band at the age of 12 and started to write some stuff down. 'Land of the Turquoise Sun' was my first (probably have that stashed away somewhere). Started playing high school dances around age 14 and sang one song at the time: 'Hey Joe' by Jimi Hendrix. I started to feel the power joy of being in a band and didn't look back. By the time I was in my early 20s my ears were ringing so bad I dropped out of rock roll to pursue a troubadour lifestyle and got turned on to Jimmy Buffett Jesse Winchester... moved to South Florida and was there for many moons. Started another band in '84 doing new wave and retro 60s and original stuff. We nearly got signed in '87 but various events caused the band to disintegrate. The White Owls eventually reformed and continued for 20 years doing parties and festivals mostly. I went back to school in the early 90s and got an Associates degree in Computer Electronics, (back when DOS was still the norm). I made a pile of money as a graphic artist/technical writer for a variety of Fortune 500 companies until the dot-com bust of 2000-2002 (I got laid off like a bunch of other people) which coincided with the birth of my daughter. At which point I became Mr. Mom and started playing out again on the weekends just to keep my fingers nimble and to get out of the house once in awhile. I'd heard of parrotheads before but was surprised to find a whole new world of like-minded folks eager to have fun and be a part of the community in a positive fashion. Now with my 2nd CD out I'm having the time of my life = living on island time. Cheers! pt
