He has had other opportunities to record on two CD projects with two local choirs in Durham, North Carolina: Abundant Blessing Chorale and the Durham Community Choir. He just recorded his first CD project with Tremaine Graham Exodus, which was released in April, 2006. Tremaine is a gifted and talented song writer in which he has written over 50 songs.
