In 1999, Sandrine Erdely-Sayo made her Chicago debut at Preston Bradley Hall for the Dame Myra Hess Memorial Concert. As a chamber musician, she has performed the major repertoire by Poulenc, Bartok, and Messiaen. Sandrine Erdely-Sayo began studying piano at the age of four with Michle Puig at the Perpignan Conservatory in France. At ten, she was awarded first prize at the Bellan International Competition in Paris. Three years later, she won gold medals in piano and chamber music. She continued her musical studies with Denyse Riviere and Christian Manen at the Paris National Superieur Conservatory where she received first prize for specialization in solfge (theory). There, she pursued special studies in harmony, counterpoint and fugue. Sandrine Erdely-Sayo has the distinction of having three of her compositions played at the Chtelet Theater in Paris. She came to the United States in

1990 for graduate studies with Susan Starr at the University of the Arts, in Philadelphia. She has recorded the integral work of Primitivo Lazaro in two CDs. She has given the world premiere of pieces by Argentinean composers and the modern world premiere of a discovered piece by Francis Poulenc at Towson University. Her next recording will include pieces by Debussy, Franck, Manen, Poulenc and Ravel.
