Babey has also collaborated with David Sorin Collyer (Liza Minelli), and has had original songs written for her by "Blue Velvet" and "(There She Is) Miss America" songwriting guru Bernie Wayne. In addition to live engagements, she has released this full-length studio CD. (It is a) mix of ballads and up-tempo swing (that) capture the "jazz-influenced

pop" genre of the 20th century songbook she is so fond of. Fans eagerly awaited the launch of her website Babey.com." Her spectacular presence, her sensual style, her costumes, warmth, wit and sparkle, all help to elevate every performance into a unique and special event.
