With the relatively recent emergence of the CD and DVD formats and the proliferation of home surround sound music systems, it has become, for the first time, commercially feasible for artists to record, and consumers to playback, multiple audio channels. Band members Koz Mraz and Ted Price were initially inspired to work "beyond stereo" after attending a surround sound seminar in 1998. Says Price, "we always envisioned our music in three dimensions and in the recording process used the existing technology to give our stereo mixes the illusion of more depth. The decision to record in DTS 6.1 Extended Surround was made in 1999, as the format was being previewed by DTS. Says Mraz, "For us, having a discrete center rear channel made a huge difference in the quality of the surround experience. Once we tried it ourselves, the choice was obvious." Subsequently, in 1999 the duo released the worlds first music recording in DTS Extended Surround, the track "Fire" which is included on their new CD.
