As a member of From Good Homes, Brady Rymer wrote, recorded, and performed with the group for 13 years, releasing a number of albums, including three on RCA records, Open Up The Sky,' From Good Homes,' and Live at Waterloo,' and sharing the stage with Bob Dylan, Dave Matthews Band, Joan Osborne, Hootie and the Blowfish, and Bob Weir's Rat Dog. In 1998 From Good Homes received an achievement award from Billboard Magazine and Irving Plaza for the most consecutive sold-out performances ever at this respected New York City venue. Since the group disbanded in 1999, a "Bring Back From Good Homes" website has been established, gathering signatures from a strong, vocal, and loyal fan base of "Homies" to encourage their return.
