Their general aesthetic is solid, yet unnervingly transgressive. Their debut album Healthy Skin is very much a product of this approach. Each song is representative of Why Twist the Hairs core live configuration of electric piano (Nick Pastel), drums (Peter Allen) and vocals, but expanded with new arrangements to include a woodwind quintet, bass, and a host of alternative keyboard instruments. The flexibility of recording has allowed Why Twist the Hair to realize their songs to an as yet unheard depth of nuance. The topics of Healthy Skin range from petty roommate disputes and skin rash to bed bug paranoia, deracination, eating disorders, and a Boston-local ballsack artist. The subjects are approached sometimes with elation, sometimes disgust, but whether the approach in general is wholly honest or ironic is undecided. The joke that is Microderm Abrasion is likewise a terrifying perception of bodily dysfunction. The earnest narrative of Belle Wether is kind of silly. The seriousness of Healthy Skin itself is in the jokes we all tell ourselves in the face of dissolution as Walking Muscles. Between alternating bursts of confidence and ambivalence, the humorous and the horrifying, Healthy Skin makes for a powerful experience. Accessible but out, Why Twist the Hair has garnered praise from hipsters and housewives, idiots and the intelligentsia alike.
