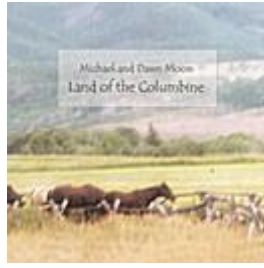


Mp3 Michael And Dawn Moon - Land Of The Columbine

Moon met his wife and singing partner, Dawn, while they had summer jobs at a guest ranch in Colorado, and they've spent the last decade working, raising their family and performing in the region. Life on the ranch Michael currently works on the 60,000-acre Matador Ranch in Northern Montana has given the pair an intimate connection with the cowboys and wide open spaces and changes of the seasons that they sing about. Michael wrote all but two of the songs on the album, from the title track (Aspen grove a half a mile wide, slip on your boots lets go for a ride. When the leaves start to turn it

can come any time, high in the land of the columbine.) to the final Horse Sweat and Saddle Leather (But nobodys makin me stay here, Im living the life that I please.
