This is the fourth CD album from JD2 and just like his other three albums, I've Got A Long, Long List, Everybody's Gunnin' 4 Me and Can't Make A Dime (On A Broken Heart), he delivers 12 more original songs that are once again different in subject matter. First it was life's peccadilloes, followed by paranoia and sarcasm, and then love and heartbreak. JD2's fourth CD deals with the tick of time. What we do with it, how we spend it and how we might regret it's passing. I asked JD2 why he chose this subject for an album. Why not! The song Short Time says: (It's such a short time - we have - to be here together - why can't

I mean that says it better than anything I'll ever write. I'm just trying to keep the thought alive. It's something to reach for, something we can all do but have not done yet. Do you think we'll ever get there? I don't know. Each one has to do their own part. But as a human society we arent looking very good based on the direction we're headed.
