Based on her life stories and dreams, Melanie's new album unfolds with quirky tales, eloquent metaphors, and streams of consciousness. The songs are delivered by a sweet young voice, floating on haunting string and piano melodies. Her music has been labelled as pop, folk, and alternative; whatever the label, the music is unmistakably complex and sensual. Melanie, who often fantasizes about being the love-child of Brian Wilson and Kate Bush, grew up in St. Catharines, Ontario, and started writing songs before she learned to play piano at age nine. At fifteen, the young songwriter began performing in pubs and nightclubs across St. Catharines, honing her songwriting craft in front of audiences blown away by the artfulness of her music and the maturity of her soul. Having been part of two consecutive musical duos since 1995 (The Tunnel Theory and Moon in Pisces), Melanie finally went solo in 2003, and brought an astonishing new power to her music. As CityTV news journalist Carey Campbell comments, Finally hearing Melanie's vocals front and centre have completed the music for her listening audience. This is the way it should be. It's no longer about the lyrics, the piano, the vocals, the harmony, the depth. The pieces all fit. It's about the music of Melanie Joy and it is ornate, moving, and lovely. Melanie has shared the stage with the likes of Andy Kim, Alan Frew, and Spirit of the West. Somehow she also found time to earn a Master's degree in writing. Since graduating, however, she has devoted herself entirely to music. "Magic" features the talents of drummer Gary Craig (Anne Murray; Jann Arden; Bruce Cockburn), guitarist Marc Ganetakos (Nelly Furtado; Mad Violet), cellist Kevin Fox (Chantal Kreviazuk; Danny Michel; Dahmnait Doyle), violinist Alex Cheung (Julie Crochetiere), bassist Rob "the Bubba" Brown (Agents of Groove),

co-producer and guitarist Peter Linseman (Mia Kulba; Cristie Healey), and Melanie on piano. By the time "Magic" was complete, co-producer Peter Linseman had signed Melanie Joy to a management deal with his company Music Mentor Productions. More recently, Melanie signed a national distribution deal with Bullseve Records. Bullseve distributes through Fusion 3 Distribution (Canada), Burnside Distribution Corporation (US), and Revolver/Universal (UK). The first single "Falling In" was released on radio fall 2006, and a promotional tour will follow. Melanie will also be working with director Stephen Scott of Spy Entertainment on the music video "Falling In." Stephen Scott has directed videos for artists including The Trews, The Tea Party, Shaggy, Creed, Barenaked Ladies, Delerium, Ron Sexsmith, and Coldplay's Chris Martin.
