"Puakenikeni" was inspired by his uncle, who's smile reflected "ear to ear joy" upon seeing three "huge " puakenikeni trees in the yard of his new home on moving day. Lance wrote "Living In The Islands," a song about some of his favorite "island things" during a short stay on the mainland.
