Highly dedicated to the craft, in just two years, the group has burst onto the Minneapolis hip-hop scene opening up for several national artists, including Joe Budden, Murphy Lee, Lil' Mo, Twista, Big Daddy Kane and Juvenile. They've also performed at The B-Girl Summit, The Hip Hop Festival, and local venues such as the Quest Nite Club, Escape Ultra Lounge, First Avenue, Red Sea, Soul City Supper Club, Blue Nile, The Dinkytowner and the

School of Performing Arts where they've received impressive reviews from local newspapers such as the Minneapolis Star Tribune, Trendsetter and City Pages.
