I am an engineering consultant when not engaged in music. Originally from Connecticut, I have lived in Cincinnati since 1971 and has become hopelessly addicted to Skyline Chili and Graeters Ice Cream. I still

It wasn't until my first year as a teacher at Roberts Paideia Academy that another teacher (Doug Sawan) found out I played the hammered dulcimer and coaxed me into dusting it off and jamming with him. Now that we've been playing seriously for several years, I decided I'd earned the right to a new toy...and so I recently purchased a brand new Webster chromatic dulcimer. It has a beautiful, rich sound. I am now--officially--a LOUD and proud dulcimer player. Doug Sawan I came to writing music late in life. I was one of those musical procrastinators who wanted to play, but kept putting it off. The first song that moved my soul was by Franki Valley and The Four Seasons. (I'm aging myself now!!) I finally began in 1990 after travelling those pathways in life that make you ask: "What am I DOING here?"
