

Shira Tirdof, meaning "song shall you pursue," is a Jewish rock music group that focuses on setting Jewish text, culture, and philosophy to original melodies that speak to a modern audience. Jeremy Gimbel, a nationally acclaimed song youth leader, and Brad Lennox, a camp counselor Temple choir member, collaborate to create and teach singable tunes perfect for camps, youth events, and synagogues. Shira Tirdof formed at URJ Camp Newman in 2005, and is on the cusp of the new sound of Jewish music. Brad is from Calabasas, CA and is currently a student at the University of Las Vegas, Nevada. Brad Lennox is a URJ Camp Newman counselor and unit head, religious school teacher, and a regular staff member for NFTY regional events. His love of music and Judaism has taken root from his
