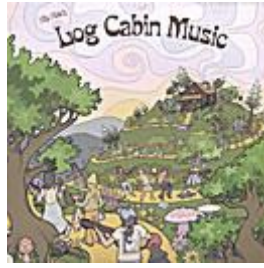


# Mp3 Kip Kale's Log Cabin Music - Rock: Roots Rock
