Her father, a talented singer and church organist, began to teach her to play the piano at age 7. This would be the first of many instruments that would come into her hands. By the time she was in the fourth grade she had taken up the alto saxophone and began to play in concert band. An important moment happened in the eighth grade when she joined the jazz band and was exposed to the music of Charlie Parker. This began a lifelong love of jazz music. She feels that there is something about the emotion that jazz music can create whether you are playing or listening to it that is invaluable. After 8 years as a saxophonist, Sherisse turned to a freelance career as an Electric Bassist. While in school, she maintained a steady freelance career playing everything from jazz and funk to latin and rock music. She most notably has performed with Patrice Rushen and Headhunter's drummer Mike Clark. Sherisse was content with being a bassist until she started to write big band charts for the Cal State University big band she was in. This was when she realized that she had found her true calling: To be a composer. She began assembling a small but steadily growing repertoire of big band and orchestral music, influenced by the styles of Gil Evans, Maria Schneider and Kenny Wheeler as well as several classicsal pieces influenced by such composers as John Corigliano, Maurice Ravel and Bela Bartok. Sherisse quickly became an accomplished composer. She received the 2001 "Best Arrangement" award from American Society of Musicians Composers and Arrangers for her orchestral arrangement of "Here's That Rainy Day". She was awarded the 2002 ASCAP Young Jazz Composers Award for her piece big band piece "Waiting". In addition, she was selected to be a composer participant for the Henry Mancini Institute in 2003 and was chosen to be featured on the Gala concert along side of Arturo Sandoval and film composer Jorge Calandrelli. Most recently she was awarded the 2004 Emerging Composer Commission in honor of Count Basie by ASCAP/IAJE. She has written music for Dave Liebman as well as Peter Erskine. Sherisse has also received commissions from the New York City All-City Jazz Band and the Souderton (Pennsylvania) High School Jazz Band. In May 2004 she received a Masters of Music in Jazz Composition from the Manhattan School of Music where she studied with great jazz composer/arranger Michael Abene. She has recently finished orchestrating and arranging the 13 movement orchestral suite "Tierra Negra", composed by Meet the Composer Grant recipient William Cepeda. Most recently she has finished recording her new CD entitled "Sleight of Hand". Sherisse hopes to successfully combine all of the worlds of music that she loves together, creating things that can survive everywhere, from the jazz club to the movie screen to the concert hall.

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
