It features his wife, Jennifer, on violin and his oldest daughter, Hanna (7), singing back up vocals. --classical includes music of any composer considered --of the Middle Ages (476-1450); Renaissance (1450-1600); Baroque (1600-1750); Classical (1750-1827); Romantic (1820-1923); Modern (1923 - 1990); Post Modern (1990 - 2054)-the case for jazz being consider classical will be judged on an individual basis. In other words, is jazz a classical artform? Well, anyone? --yes, get your paper out, take notes, chop chop, each class is a week. Yes, time to begin. We can finish this syllabus later.
