During his college career he had the good fortune to study with some of the finest flutists teaching today. In this capacity, his primary

influences include Marianne Gedigian, Jacques Zoon, James Walker, and Linda Toote. Additional influences include Louis Moyse, Steven Finley, and Paula Robison. In addition to orchestral, chamber, and solo performances throughout New England, Mr. Workman has appeared at the Hampden-Sydney Chamber Music Festival, the Flynn Theater, the Lake Placid International Institute, the Boston Museum of Fine Arts, and on Vermont Public Radio. He can also be heard performing with Boston-based chamber groups including the Commonwealth Chamber Players and the Fensgate Chamber Players. As a private flute instructor, Mr. Workman has taught flute in Vermont, Boston, and Los Angeles, and has also presented flute master classes for the Music Education Division of the Boston University College of Fine Arts. Currently he maintains a private studio in the Greater Boston Community.

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
