Johnny's concrete and steady beats created a solid foundation for the music and with his Long Island heritage and punk rock contempt, the band immediately bonded. Within weeks the boys rehearsed a set of songs, recorded a quick three track EP, and began playing show after show after show. It didn't take long for the unique and disparate, yet strangely complimentary, talents of Frankie, Josh, and Johnny to be noticed. From shows in basements, to small clubs, to larger venues opening for

national acts, such as the Undead, Murphy's Law, Two Man Advantage, Plan A Project, The GC5, the Forgotten, the Casualties, The River City Rebels and many more, audiences always seem to get it and have a good time when Plastic Jesus hits the stage. With thier brand new debut CD 'So You Say Rock Roll's A Sin...' the band is determined to put the pedal down and push the limits of punk rock n' roll. So strap yourself in because the E-brake is off, the gas tank is full, and these thugs are cruising in their tricked out ghetto wagon with it's plume of black smoke, spewing punk rock n' roll from the rusted exhaust pipe covering everything they pass with the speckled dirt of Plastic Jesus.
