Country Talent Search to mainstage appearances at the Big Valley Jamboree, Merritt Mountain Music Festival, Nashville North, Dauphin Country Fest and countless venues in between, Stephanie has channelled her love of singing into a successful independent career. As an independent recording artist, Stephanie realizes the need for diversity. In addition to concerts featuring her original material, she indulges her love of other forms of music with shows tailored to specific needs, whether country, rock/pop, 50's/60's, 80's hits, or a combination of these.
