Press Daryl Pierces 2004 self-titled release is like a ride on a slow-moving cloud. The atmosphere is thick with condensed pop hooks, and Pierces upright bass and light voice guarantee a smooth ride. Live drums and guitar, as well as synthetic beats and keyboard lines intelligently accent Pierces soulful voice. The result is a record that defies a single genre, yet has an internal cohesion, allowing each song to inform the others. Objectify, the albums opener is an upbeat number, showcasing Pierces energetic sound, and establishing his voice with live instruments. Deeper cuts such as Expatriate and Secrets reveal a darker mood and emphasize Pierces talents for electronic arrangements and thick aural environments. His bass playing is especially at home on the instrumental Watering Hole, in which the instrument takes on a rich, organic quality in the midst of
