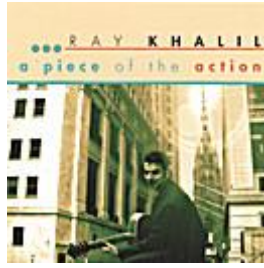


Mp3 Ray Khalil - A Piece Of The Action

Ray has been featured in many jazz magazines including a full article in Ireland's "Jazz News." His quartet was chosen to represent Canada at the Yokohama Exotic Showcase 1989 in Japan. Ray currently performs in various venues in New York city and abroad.
