The week of the session the guitar player Mark had selected flaked on us and rather than reschedule the session we asked Chet for his suggestions. He said to use Chris Pinnick. When I asked him if we should think of anyone else he just said, "No". He was right. Chris is one of the best and I'm so glad he played on my record. They both brought in Ric Fierabracci who's work on the bass is amazing. He's also got to be one of the best people on fretless bass that I've ever heard. For background vocals, Linda Jackson came in and ripped it up where it needed ripping and sweetened it up where it needed sweetening. She's great. But the best thing was Mark Paladino who produced, coerced, mixed, and put himself into this project heart and soul. I can't tell you what a joy it was to work with all of these great people and have fun spending all that money. Have you bought a CD yet? As for the CD photos and design we have Robert John to thank for great pictures. Anybody who gets a good profile of me is truly amazing.
