Recent collaborations include concerts with Bill Staines, Robin Lee Berry, Michael Camp, Beans, Denice Franke, and Jim Crockett. It is not uncommon to see these diverse musicians along side some of the finest players in the area as sidemen. Currently, they have several CD's of original music available, two of which are "3rd Coast" releases. The boys also have original solo efforts, and often are found on compilation recordings, as well as CD's by other local artists. Currently, N3C is working on a new recording with the newest configuration of personnel, due out summer 05. Along with original music, the "New 3rd Coast" is known to extend its repertoire with a wide selection of cover tunes in a variety of musical styles. Their performances are exciting and appropriate for all age groups and venues. Completely self-managed and self-contained, the trio continues to develop a devoted following.
