We recorded live, and I think the CD captures a lot of that "live feel," which I think is cool. Anyway, right after I got done with the CD my wife got transferred to San Francisco, and I went along. There I sort of fell into a job trading options on the floor of The Pacific Stock Exchange. Did you ever see "Trading Places?" You know that part at the end with the orange juice futures?
