Seans list of accomplishments are endlesshaving engineered and worked alongside of Jim Jonsin who has produced for artists such as Jamie Foxx, Ludacris, Trick Daddy, Pitbull and Trina. These two have proved to be an unstoppable force since the day they met in South Florida. As time passed and these two artists became serious, they had collected enough material to put out their first album throughout the neighborhood. The locals loved it and 32 oz. was soon filling empty bars with fans at open mic nights. The fans begged for more material and more shows...they got them both. 32 oz. has performed as the opening act for "Common" at Coolworld. D.J.
