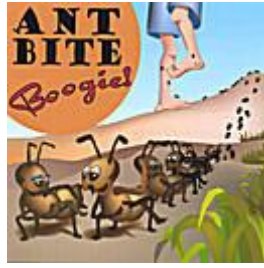


## Mp3 Patricia Baker Presents - Ant Bite Boogie

Yeah, I loved platform shoes, sequined halter-tops, mirrored disco balls and John Travolta! As time progressed and I got older, I found bluegrass comforting and familiar.
