With my dad being the lead singer, and only "black" member of the band, it's quite obvious to see how the band "NIGHT DAY" got their name! At a young age I was constantly around my father, which meant I was constantly around music. Music at home, music in the car, Soul music, R B music, Rap music, and most importantly and significantly Gospel music! The Glenn family migrated to a little town about 55 miles north of Santa Maria called Paso Robles. There I was raised with lots of love, many butt whippings, good cooking, church, church, and more church. (no exaggeration) We had Sunday

school, morning worship service, 3 O'clock service, prison ministry outreach service, BTU service, prayer meeting, teachers meeting, mission service, bible study, 2 choir rehearsals, youth meeting, not to mention being invited to attend other church services. And I probably didn't name half of them. (LOL) My beautiful mother Velma who also grew up in Paso Robles, was brought up in a God-fearing family. She decided to raise her family up in the same God-fearing fashion. She began feeding me the gospel and teaching me God's word, day in and day out. She made certain I attended every church service I could possibly attend. Especially the youth meetings. She always told me, listen to what Sister Fran is telling you. And just like Forrest Gump, I did just what momma said. There are so many intricate people who played an important role in my life. Some living and some have gone on home to glory. But I have to mention mom #2, Sister Frances Forman, (aka) Sis Fran. This woman of God taught me, cared for me, encouraged me, disciplined me, counseled me, guided me, watched over me, shared with me, laughed with me, cried with me, supped with me, corrected me, and loved me as if I were her very own child. I love her dearly, more than any words can say... I was pretty hard-headed, so we didn't always see eye to eye, but God used her wisdom, love, and knowledge to give me ideas of how the church ministry should be taken to the next level. God would give me a vision of how he wanted to be lifted up in a more non-traditional fashion. Sure all the hand claps, singing, playing music, shouting hallelujah, are all forms of praise and when praises go up, blessings come down. But none of these will bring souls to Christ. Bringing (lifting) the name of Jesus Christ up in conversation, sharing his goodness, letting our light shine. Giving the world a visual picture, and reasoning of why we worship and praise God. That is what he wants us to do as believers. (JOHN 12:32) We owe God our lives, and although most of us are good people, being a good person (biblically) will not get you into heaven. After the fall of man (Adam Eve) our human nature began to rely on proof as the evidence of reality. God wants us to follow his direction solely based on faith in his holy word. Faith is the substance of

things hoped for, and the evidence of things not seen.. (HEBREWS 11:1) So I challenge you to step out of the natural way of belief, and go back to the spiritual belief of faith. I've taken myself out of the equation and realized that I didn't do anything to deserve salvation... It's not my stature, or my financial contribution to the world.
