Junior was in the wings awaiting his call from Buddy he sat down with Michael and showed him some licks that only the Godfather of the blues harmonica can do. There's no question that Junior was one of the kindest people Michael John has ever met. Shortly after, Michael John played a benefit for Willie Dixon at the Music Machine in Santa Monica, CA. After his set Willie waved Michael John over to his table put his big arm around him and said "Man, you's a damn good singer don't you ever stop singing the blues". The rest was history. God bless both Willie and Junior. In addition to Willie and Junior, Albert Collins, all three Kings, and of course his very good friend Coco Montoya have all played a big part in influencing his life and his love for the blues. Michael John and The Bottom Line have shared the stage with The Robert Cray Band, Taj Mahal The Phantom Blues band, The Fabulous Thunderbirds, Robben Ford, Bobby "Blue" Bland, and Rod Piazza just to name a few.
