A post be-bop jazz pianist, Larry lists his major influences as Bill Evans, Wynton Kelly, and Miles Davis. After graduate

school Larry toured with his trio Spice of Life, vocalist George Chapin, and other local bandleaders. In 1996 Larry joined James Bazens Music Unlimited Big Band.
