

Guilty: Sex, lust, self-deception, addictions, helpless, stuck, taking responsibility, coming to terms...fessing up...honesty...self-dislosure...Confession?... The first step to a much healthier lifestyle... 11. Dreaming: If I could only go back and do some things I didn't, and not do some things I did...
