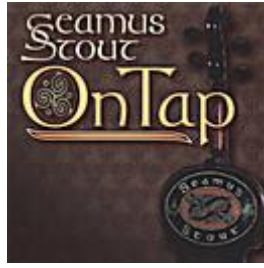


Mp3 Seamus Stout - On Tap
