Tamika has also performed for the National Council of Negro Women and the San Francisco Chapter of National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (NARAS). Tamika was also featured on Bay Area Vista on NBC 11 in 2003. In addition to being an energetic and thoughtful performer, Tamika also released an independent commercial project entitled "My Message".
