The recording took place exclusively in Belmont Studios, which also happens to double as Robin's living room. Despite some interesting challenges (like the birth of Dean's first baby and a nasty threat by the landlord if they didn't stop playing the djembe), the album was complete in six months! Many of her tunes are written about various aspecs of the wilderness and thoughts thereof. Since she is much more at home 10,000 feet up a mountain than in a cubicle of any height, this is only natural (no pun intended). Music is an avenue that she uses not only to describe what is actually seen in the wilderness, but to try and paint a picture of a lifestyle and paradigm through which it is possible to make sense of the craziness of the world.
