
Mp3 Tlt50 - Eye Of Destruction

"Make A Wish Come True"...4:46 A familiar sounding song mostly live tracks with a sprinkle of sampled drums. 10. "Exit Overture"...10:12 A Pink Floyd-ish beginning with a reassuring finish.
