Nocturnalis reminds me of some intuitions of the first recordings of bands like Hunting Lodge or The Metgubnerbone. A deeply dark and tense music, full of raising noises. The tracks of this CD are capable of involving the listener totally and catching his attention. The title of this album gets the point and represents very well what the band does with their percussed homemade instruments. Somehow this album is an ideal meeting point between jazz improvisation, ambient, tribal and industrial music and it's the best you could get.
