IT ALL STARTED... in 2001 when Brad Carr began putting together a band which consisted of himself as lead singer/guitarist, Jack Vanderflught on drums and Dennis McElroy on bass guitar and background vocals. The following year, Rhonda Mickelson joined the group as keyboardist and lead/background singer. We started out as Flashback, playing strictly Classic Rock cover tunes. After honing our sound, we began writing originals. The first song Better Days inspired the new name: GRAND RIVER CROSSING. BAND BIOS Brad grew up in a big old house full of guitars, pianos, brass, woodwind, percussion and other strange noises. When the music grew too loud for practical family living conditions, he and his siblings were exiled by their parents, Berk and Joyce, to the smoke house; a tool shed on their farm where the music played on. Brad organized the band on the campus of Graceland University in Lamoni, Iowa after a short 14-year sabbatical. Previous work includes, electric bluegrass with Homegrown, new and classic country with Ramblin' Fever, classic rock with Storm, and alternative rock with The Decibels. Brad's influences: Jesus, Mom and Dad, Leonard Rummery, Neil Young, Tom Petty and Brad's favorite thing in the world is spending time with Sharon, Tim, Alex and Jack.
